Course guide



Welcome to Saare Golf, the first and only golf course on island Saaremaa since 2008. The course is located right next to city of Kuressaare on its western side.

Saare Golf is set on an expanse of nature's finest golfing land, a challenge to all lovers of game of golf. It is a course where the contours of the ground are as much of a factor as the elements of the weather.

When standing anywhere on the course in front of you lies a wonderful blend of unique individual holes, living in harmony with the flora and fauna that can be only experienced on an island in the Baltic sea.




You will have the opportunity to challenge your control of the golf ball from elevated tees exposed to the sea winds. Tight and rolling fairways are dry and firm from early spring till late autumn. Beware of well placed bunkers and many lakes on the course.

Finally you reach the greens, true nature's dance floor. One of a kind design, the surfaces reflect their quality and fineness of turf and reading the contours becomes as much an art as the putt itself.


Saare Golf is a real championship golf course, loved and respected by all who take time to appreciate the challenge that only the nature of Saaremaa can create.



Course guide legend - fairway lay-out

- ————— Black dot is the distance point. In most cases it is the edge of the bunker or pond. It can also be a pine tree or a big and visible stone
- 222** **171**
249 ————— Black digits mark distances from yellow tee to the black dot. **Red digits** mark distances from black dot to the middle of the green. **Grey digits** mark distances from the black dot to the intermediate point (black dot with grey zero)
-  ————— Distance to/from deciduous tree
-  ————— Point where horizon hole photograph is taken
- Tees**  ————— Arrow and text "Tees" shows the direction to the tees

Course guide legend - green lay-out

- 0,0** ————— Green zero level point in the front edge of the green
- + 0,57** ————— Green surface height compare to the front of the green
-  ————— Green tilting direction
- T** ————— Front edge point of the green based on intended playing line

Markers on the fairway (red 100m, yellow 150m and white 200m) are measured to the middle of the green

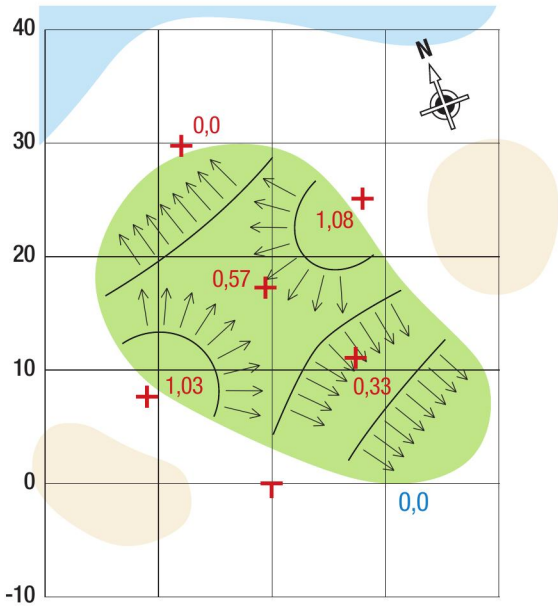

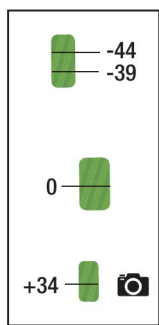

Hole 1, par 5

An ideal drive would favour the left side of the fairway. A good line is to aim to the middle of the left fairway bunker. This gives options to place the second shot to preferable distance. Double check the pin position - if it's tucked at the back of the green, do not go long!

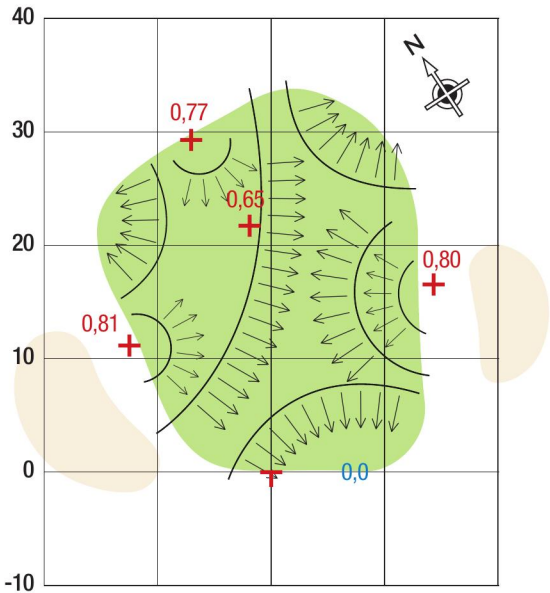

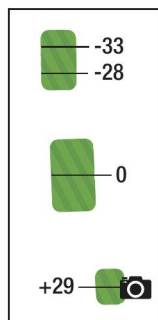

Hole 2, par 4

This hole is not too demanding off the tee but longer hitters want to be aware of the fairway bunkers on left and right. The green is rather large so make sure you have plenty of club for the second shot.

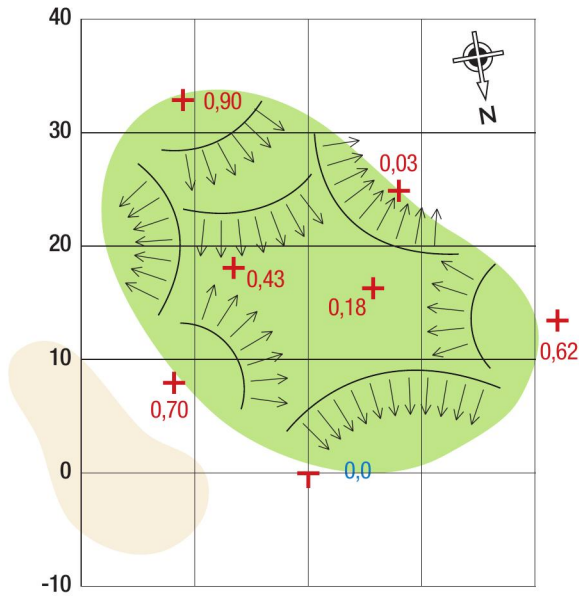

Hole 3, par 4

Aim just left of the tree on the right side of the fairway. The slope of the fairway will have the ball rolling downhill and to the left. The trouble is at the back of the green.

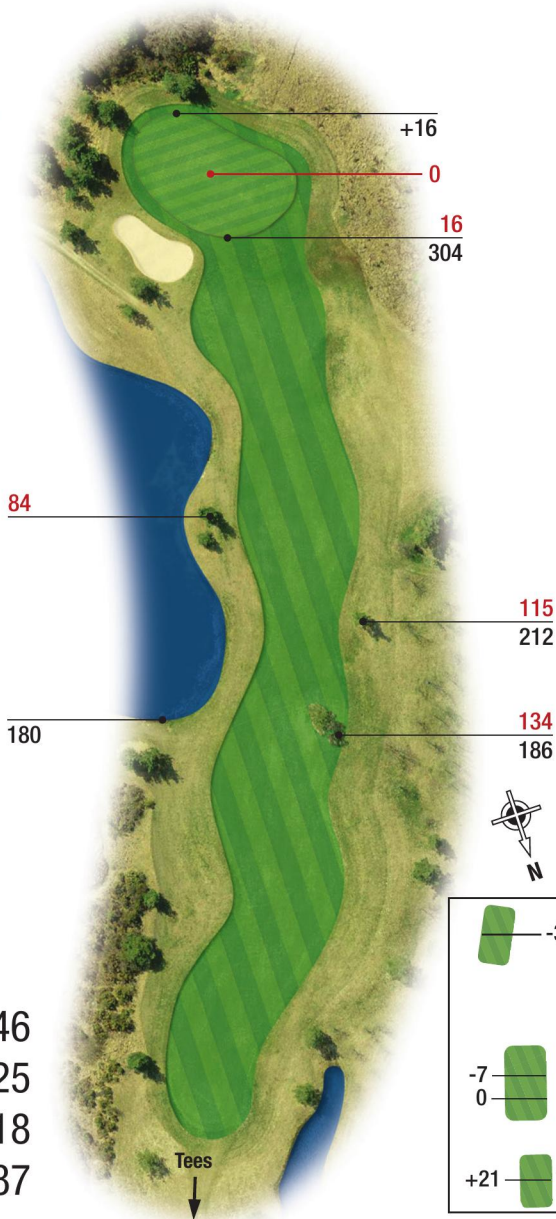

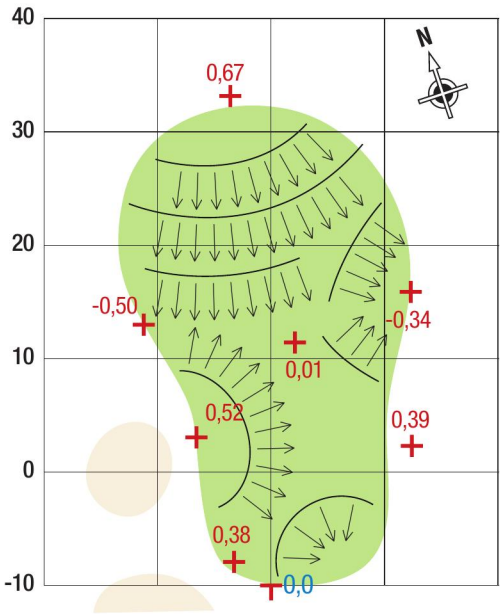

Hole 4, par 5

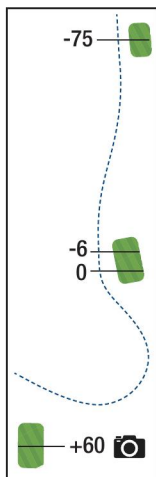
Most difficult hole on the golf course. A tricky par 5 where a good tee shot is vital. Aim straight down the middle of the fairway. The second shot leaves a bit more room to play with but with the two tiered green the approach shot needs to be accurate. Also if you are playing your third shot from further than 150m from the green the steep green side bunker on the left might not be visible.

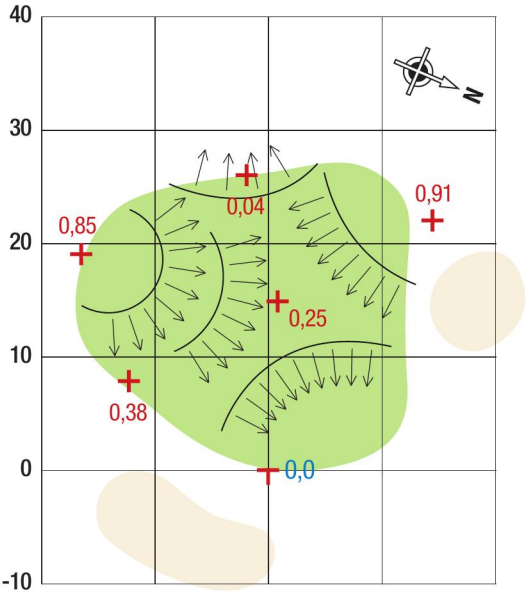

Hole 5, par 3

Easiest hole on the golf course - just get the correct club. Middle of the green is safe but since it's a short hole a good chance to go for the pin.

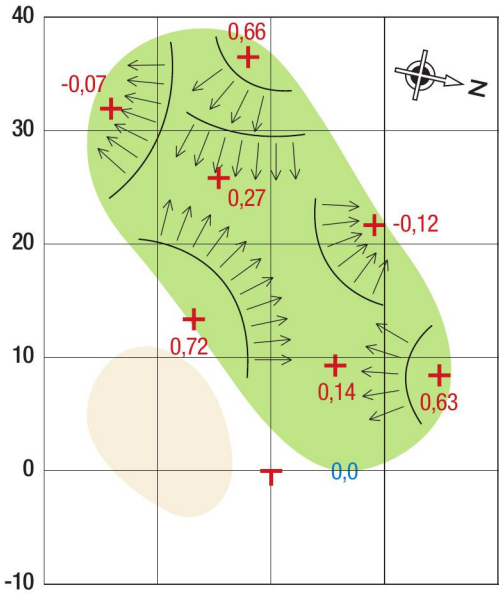

Hole 6, par 4

A slight downhill par 4 that requires a well placed tee shot. A good line is left edge of bunker in the middle of the fairway. Anything missed too far to the right is most likely lost. Any shot just to the very front of the green will roll back to the fairway. The green is long and narrow.

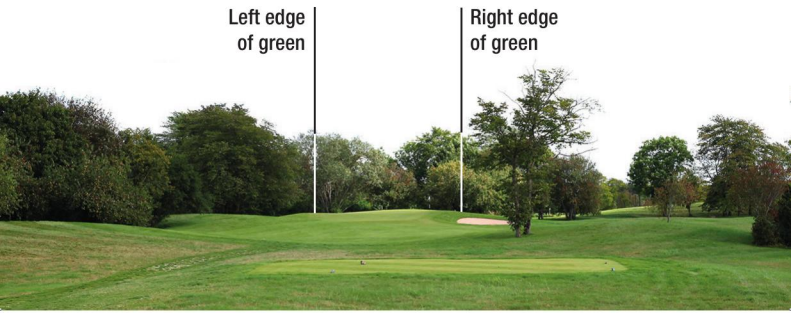
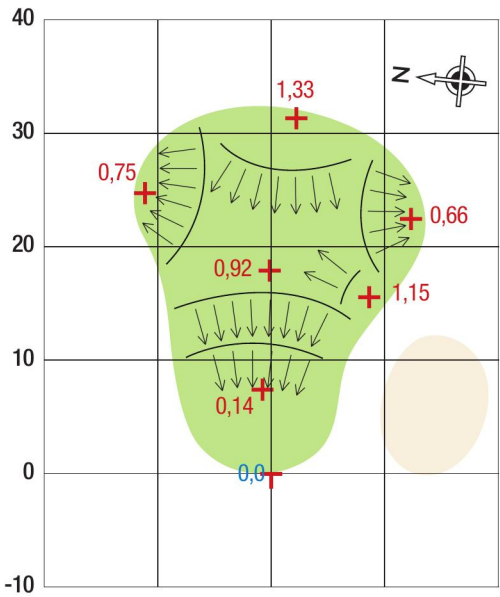

Hole 7, par 3

Very tricky two tiered green that requires excellent execution - a long and accurate shot to the same level with the pin. A par feels like a birdie on this hole.



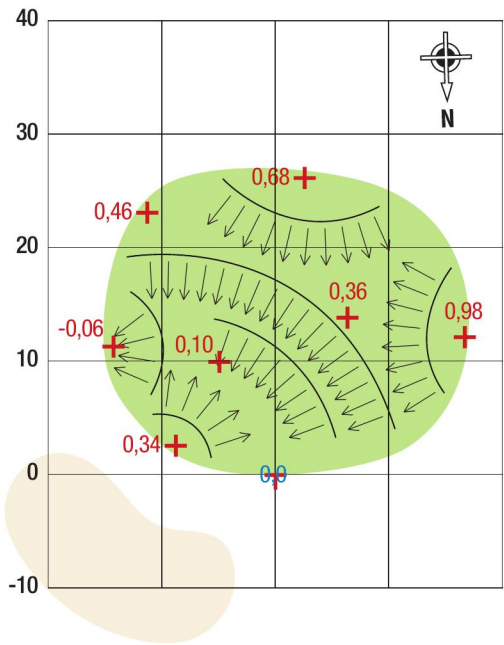

Hole 8, par 4

Demanding tee shot with water protecting both sides of the narrow fairway. Aim at the middle of the fairway bunker, fairway also kicks from right to left. Anything short and left with the second shot will be caught by the green side bunker.

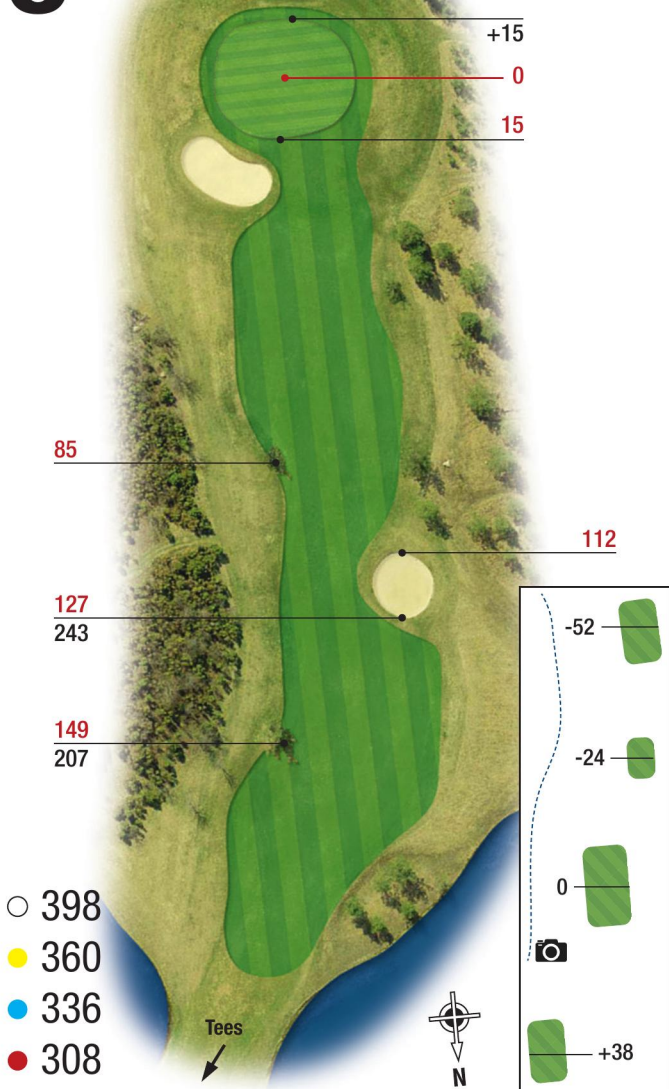

Hole 10, par 3

Short par 3 with a very tricky green. Depending on the pin position you definitely want to be below the hole on this green as a downhill putt can easily roll off the putting surface. A severe slope towards the water for any shot that misses the green to the left.

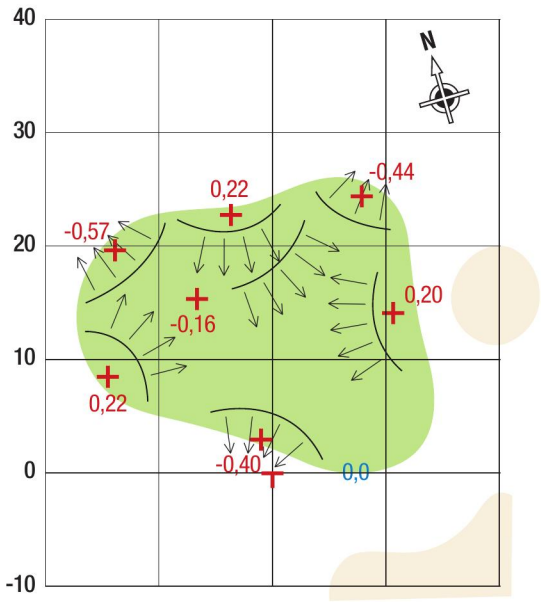

Hole 11, par 4

The longest par 4 is the second most difficult hole on the course. Aim your tee shot to the left side of the fairway. Second shot will be long, especially when you're playing against the wind.

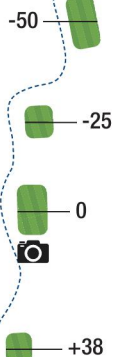

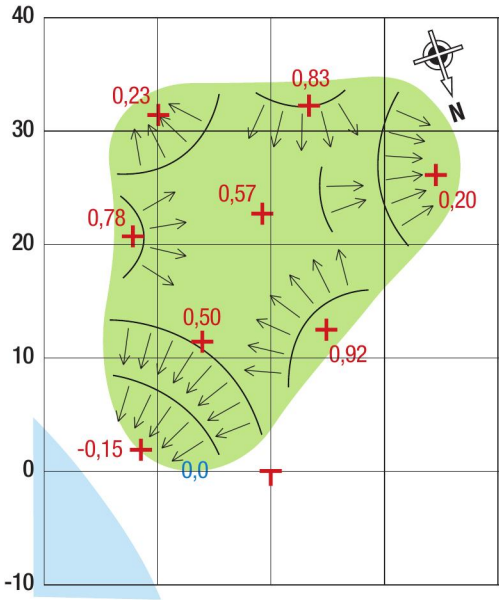

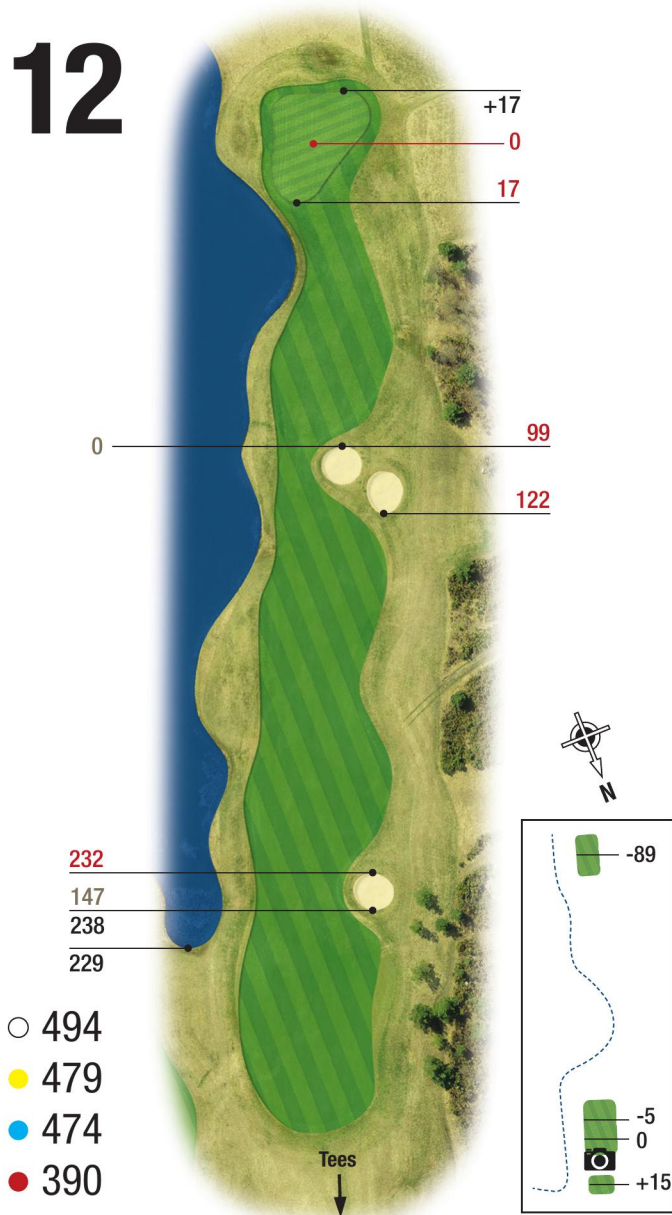


Hole 12, par 5

Aim over the ladies/red tee box and be aware of the out of bounds (OB) on the right. The second shot is wiser played just short of the bunkers. The fairway bunkers are rather steep and if the ball is close to the lip it's a difficult third shot.

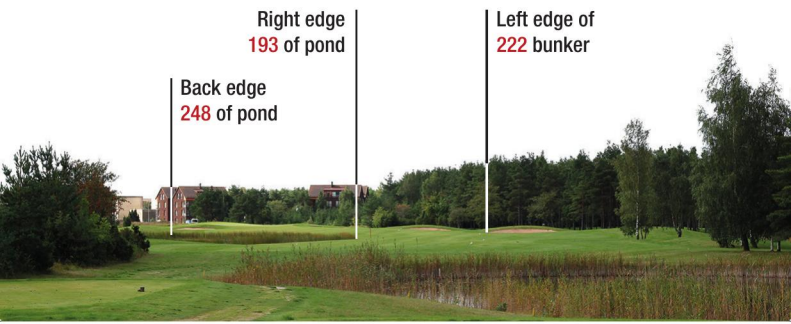
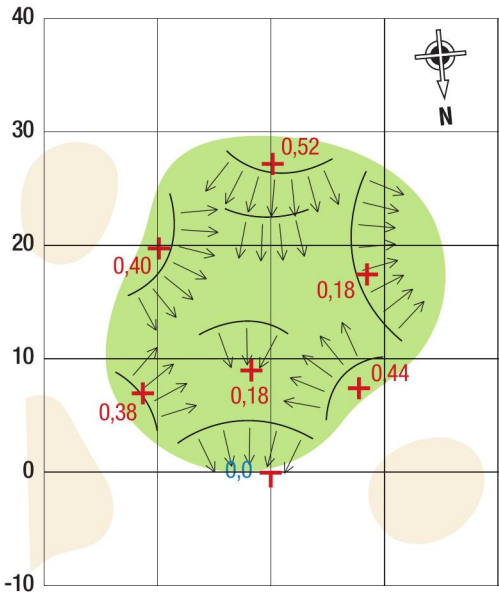

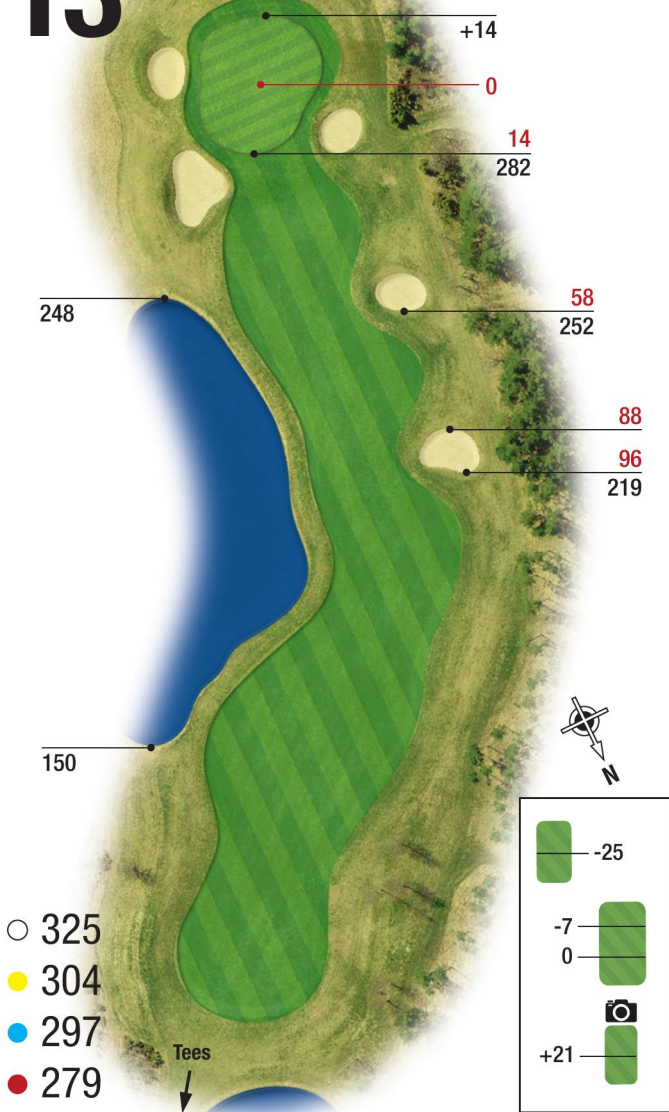


Hole 13, par 4

A short par 4. Aim at the left edge of the fairway bunker on the right. The fairway tilts towards the water on the left. One of the flattest greens on the course.

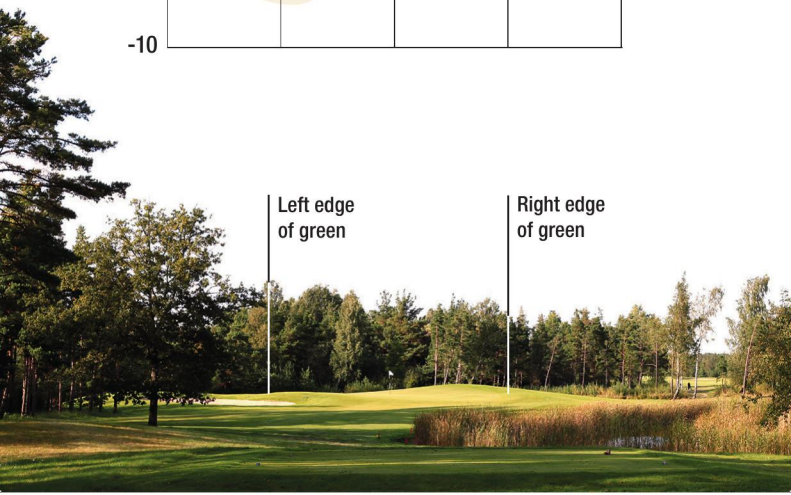
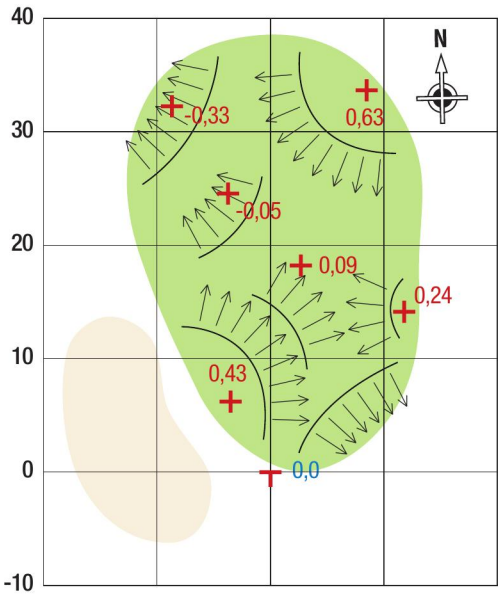

Hole 14, par 3

Middle of the green is perfect. The bailout side would be right side of the green. It's an easy bump and run to save a par from there.

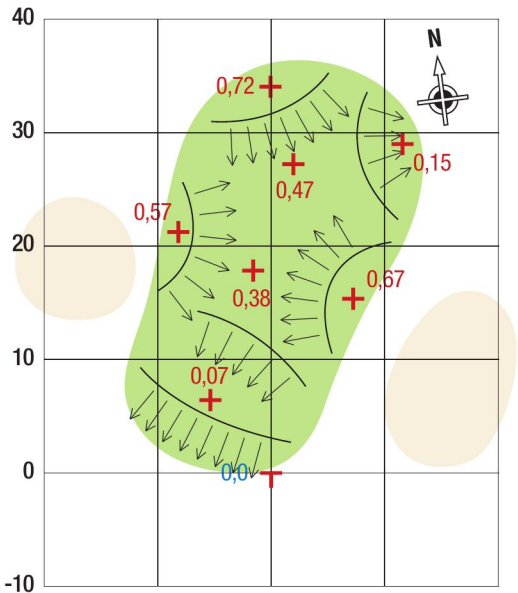

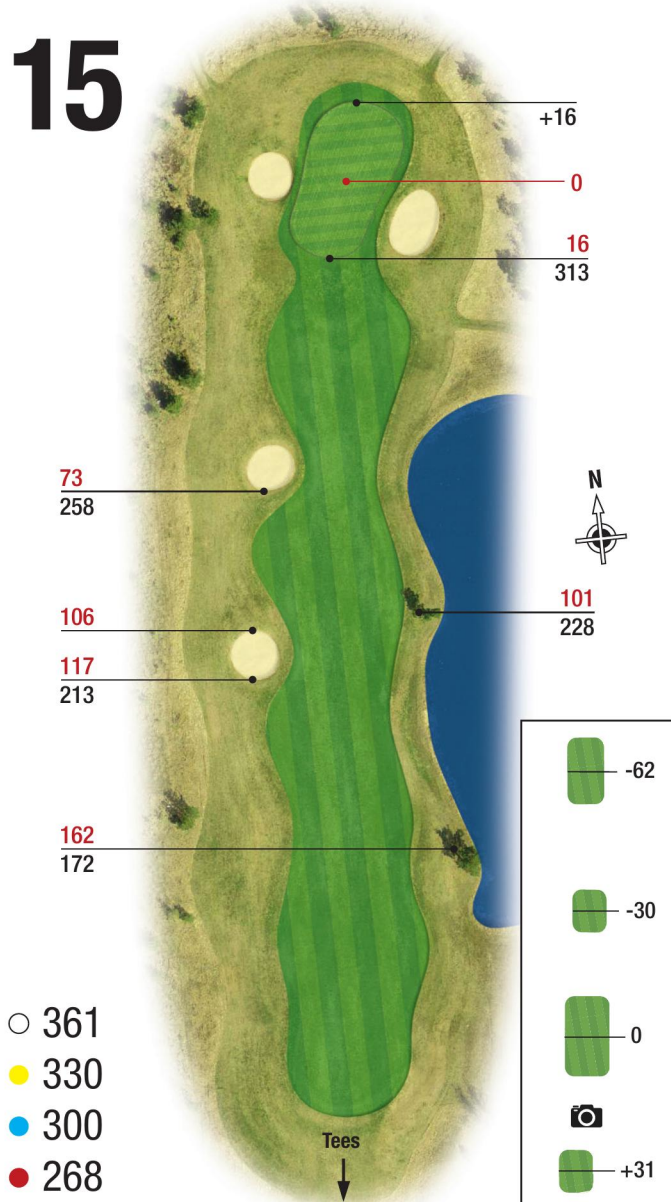


Hole 15, par 4

Aim your tee shot straight down the middle of the fairway, if the ball is missed it too far left it's likely a third one off the tee. This hole allows to make a more conservative shot off the tee. For the second shot the trouble is clearly visible - green side bunkers on left and right will catch an errant shot.

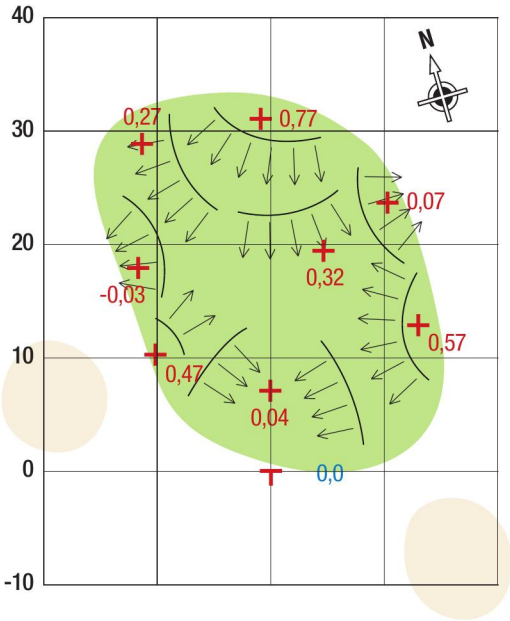

Hole 16, par 5

Aim at the left edge of the bunker on the left. Although the green is reachable in two for the long hitters, most would be happy with a nice pitch shot close to the pin. Be aware of the pin position - an uphill putt would be perfect.



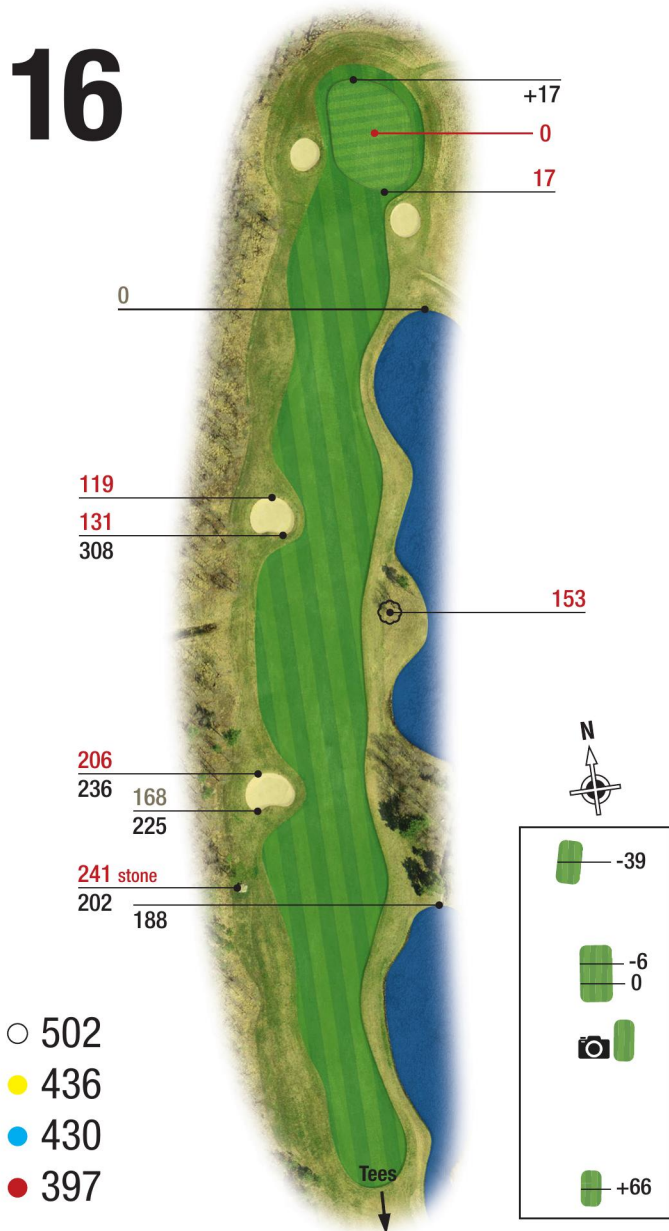

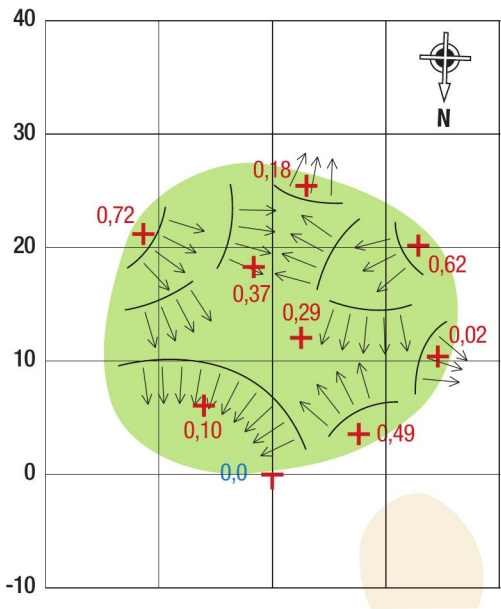

Hole 17, par 4

Place your tee shot in the middle of the two bunkers. If you miss the second shot just short of the green to the left it's not a difficult up&down.



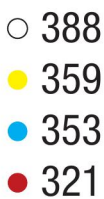

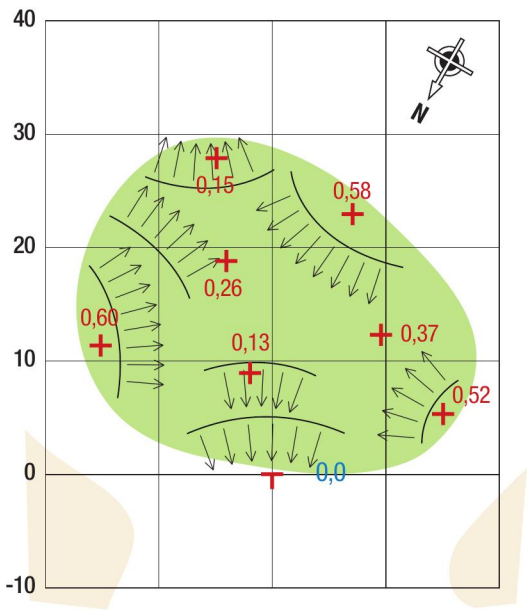

Hole 18, par 4

Favour slightly the right side of the fairway as missing it left might leave you behind the trees without a chance to go for the green. The second shot needs to be precise, there is quite a bit of trouble around the green. Don't forget to thank the gallery on the clubhouse's terrace.



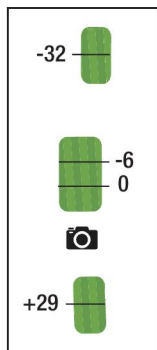
